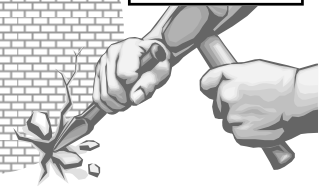

HLG CELEBRATES 20 YEARS!

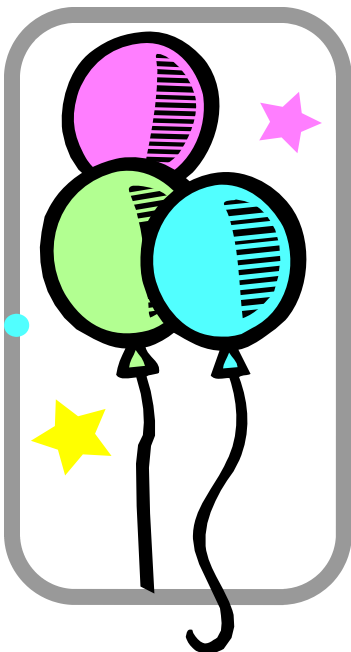
Wow! Twenty years! My whole sense of time is now distorted and it sometimes seems hard to tell if things happened 19 days ago or 19 years ago.

Anyway, it's certainly been interesting. I am fortunate to have had good clients who are good people. That sure makes things a lot more pleasant. It also helps that I have tried to focus on constructive activities, like helping clients structure relationships, minimize risks and get projects built instead of declaring legal war on other people. I think most of the players in our industry are interested in building and being positive rather than being negative and disputatious.

One question that I have been asked frequently over the years is "don't you miss being an architect?" I guess it depends on perspective. One is that "everything is a design problem." I have tried to look at legal work with the same design sense as would be applied to a planning or construction problem. Another truth is that relatively few architects really earn their keep as pure designers. And many of the best architects, by the time they are in their 40s or so, have a leadership and/or ownership position in their firm. At that point they spend a large amount of time on management, contracts, HR, and other such things, sometimes to the exclusion of pure design time. So I am not that different from many of my peers -- it's just that I get to do that work in the context of 200 firms, not just one.

Thank you all for allowing me into your practices and lives. Let's see if we can get to 30 years.
